Parent/Teacher Conferences are Next Week!

Conference dates are Wednesday evening, November 20, Thursday evening November 21 and all day Friday November 22. **No school** for students on Friday, Nov. 22. The purpose of the parent-teacher conference is to strengthen the partnership between home and school so your child can be a successful learner. It's a time for you to clarify learning expectations for your child, hear how your child is progressing and work together to find ways we can help your child be the best possible citizen and student at Morning Star.

K - 5 Mid-trimester & Report Card Guidelines

In a standards-based learning environment, the emphasis is on learning and continual progress. The standards on the grade-level report card represent end-of-year goals or where a student is expected to be at the end of the school year.

We utilize the guidelines in determining a child's proficiency level and ensure all students are held accountable for reaching the same levels of proficiency regardless of their ability or effort. The Performance Level Descriptors (I-IV) describe students' knowledge, skills, and abilities in a content area. These descriptions provide a picture or profile of student achievement. Along with these descriptors are the following Characteristics of a Successful Learner that describe the habits and skills that contribute to learning:

**Accepts responsibility of own actions and the consequences that accompany them*

**Applies previous knowledge to new situations*

**Asks thoughtful questions to further learning*

**Cooperates with others while learning*

**Critiques the reasoning of others respectfully*

**Explains answers and adjusts thinking with reflection and feedback*

**Follows the expectations of adults, the classroom, and the school*

**Learns independently when given a task*

**Makes productive use of learning time*

**Perseveres in learning situations*

**Seeks information and help when needed*

**Selects appropriate learning tools strategically*

**Takes responsibility for assigned tasks*

**Takes risk to further learning*

Bozeman School District Vision Screening

Vision screening will take place on Tuesday November 19th and Tuesday December 3rd. This year the district nurse has worked with the Lions Club to utilize a new vision screening procedure. The Plusoptix machine is an autorefractor that is used with children. The Plusoptix works by taking a picture of the student's eyes. The student stands at a distance of 3' from the machine and looks into the camera. Once the screener has an accurate reading from the machine, the picture is taken. The Plusoptix measures several different measurements of the eye and can catch nearsightedness, farsightedness, corneal irregularities and eye alignment. The machine will determine if there is a concern and a referral sheet can be printed for your child's eye doctor.

Capital Improvement and Reserve Fund Planning

The Financial Advisory Committee (FAC) is a group of parent volunteers charged with reviewing PAC financials and providing direction to the PAC officers and the Morning Star parent community for funds to be spent for capital improvements, and those funds to be held in reserve to insure the long term viability of the PAC to serve the school. The current financial committee will be meeting soon, and make a recommendation to allocate funds for both the reserve account and capital improvement projects. This allocation of funds will be reviewed and put to vote at the November 21st PAC meeting.


