Hi, my name is Libby Michaud and I am your Parent Liaison. I will be posting monthly information for you as parents. ## WeTip

The Bozeman Police Department and the Bozeman Public Schools partner to provide the WeTip hotline to students and their families. The WeTip hotline at **1-800-78-CRIME** may be used by anyone to anonymously report crimes that have been committed at any of our schools or in our community.

While students are always encouraged to talk with an adult at the school, students are sometimes reluctant to report crime information. WeTip provides an alternative for students and families who wish to give information and remain anonymous.

WeTip hotlines are answered by tip operators 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. Calls are taken on all crimes affecting schools and the surrounding communities. All calls are anonymous, not just confidential. The operator asks a series of questions, designed by law enforcement, to obtain the maximum amount of information about the reported crime. After the information is taken, a code name and number are assigned to the informant. The WeTip operator takes the information and passes it on to Bozeman's School Resource Officers who will conduct their own investigation. # Information from Marilyn King, Deputy Superintendent

The Bozeman Public Schools and the Bozeman Police Department have a long-standing, successful, collaborative relationship. Our growing enrollment and new needs in the areas of prevention and community policing have provided both organizations an opportunity to update the School Resource Officer model to best support students and the work of the District. The District will now have four School Resource Officers who will deliver prevention curriculum instruction as well as provide community policing. It is our pleasure to introduce Officer Richardson, who will be specifically assigned to Morning Star, Sacajawea, Irving and Longfellow. Please look for Officer Richardson at the many school activities as well as on the playground. All of our officers look forward to meeting and working with our students. If you visit our school, don't be surprised to see him eating lunch with students, interacting with children on the playground, or teaching in class!



### **Reverse 911**

Bozeman School District #7 has an agreement with the Gallatin County 911 Center to use their Reverse 911 system for parent and staff notifications in the case of an emergency. Because of this it is extremely important that telephone information be up to date for your student. If you change phone numbers for any of the numbers listed below, please notify your school with the new information immediately.

Up to two parent phone numbers will be called. If you have more than one student in the school district, the emergency system will automatically remove any duplicate calls. The phone numbers are selected from our Student Information database in the following order:

- 1. Custodial Mother/Guardian's cell phone
- 2. Custodial Father/Guardian's cell phone
- 3. Custodial Step-Mother cell phone
- 4. Custodial Step-Father cell phone
- 5. Other Guardian cell phone
- 6. Home Phone
- 7. Custodial Parent Work Phone.

For Example, if both custodial parents have a cell phone, their cell phones will be listed for the emergency notification calls. Another Example, If the student lives with a Custodial Mother and Custodial Step-Father, and there is a cell phone in our records for the Mother, no cell phone listed for the Step Father, and no home phone, and a work phone number for the Step Father, the emergency notification calls will go to the Custodial Mother's cell phone and the Custodial Step-Father's work phone.

## **Emergency Evacuation Procedures**

In the event of an evacuation at Morning Star School, students and staff will walk to Sacajawea Middle School. Please refer to the Student/Parent handbook for more information about our emergency drills.

# News from the Lunch Room

Lunch Prices for this year are the same as last year. Lunches this year are \$2.50 for lunch, 45 cents for snack milk or lunch milk, and an adult meal is \$3.55. The 2nd entree or double costs \$2.00. If your student gets a lunch with a 2nd entree the price is \$4.50 a day. Parents are invited to join their child for lunch, just call the office prior to 9:00 am to place your order. A student has to have money in their account in order to get a snack milk. Please make sure your student has enough money in their account. Mrs. Mooney will be stamping their hand when their balance is \$5.00, which will give them time to get more money into their account. Please send checks versus cash, makes it easier to track if there are any issues.

### **Birthday Treats & Invitations**

TREATS: For those parents wishing to send birthday treats, please:

(1) Send individual, healthy treats that can be eaten with little mess and without utensils. Be sure to check with the teacher to determine whether any food allergies exist.

(2) Send healthy treats that contribute to each student's learning.

(3) Notify the teacher at least a day in advance so that he/she can coordinate the number of treats brought on any one school day.

INVITATIONS: Please mail invitations to children your child wishes to invite rather than sending them to school for distribution. Your sensitivity and cooperation in finding other avenues for delivery of invitations is greatly appreciated and will help us avoid any hurt feelings.
