State Testing

 $\sim 4_{th}$ grade students will participate in the Science CRT (Criterion Referenced Test) March 4-6. It is critical that all 4_{th} graders are present during this limited testing window as they are required by the state to participate. ~Grades 3-5 will participate in the full-scale pilot of the new Smarter Balanced State Assessment beginning April 14. The assessment includes both math and English language arts and is aligned to the Montana Core Standards.



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Capital Expenditure Update:

The Capital Expense request that was put forth by the Financial Advisory Committee (FAC) was presented, voted on and approved at this week's PAC Meeting.

It was approved to spend up to \$12,070 to purchase 20 iPads and the supporting Wi-Fi access point for the teaching staff.

This technology will support instruction, data collection and formative feedback to students. The iPad provides access to numerous apps many that are common core apps they will enhance teaching and learning in all content areas including core subjects, art, music, library and health enhancement.
