Holiday Program

We Take Responsibility

Sunset Shovelers and Morning Shovelers Needed for Ice Rink

(Time commitment per session about 30 minutes)

The ice rink team is looking for individuals to help with daily maintenance of the rink.

Sunset Shovelers: Ice scraping is done just before sunset. (Thus you will see the time changes throughout the season). This scraping smoothes out the ice and removes the snow, so that Mr. Curtice is able to come and place more water down on the ice getting it ready for the next day. We need people for Sunday, Mon. Tues. Wed and Thursday night. This work involves using a shovel. Times start at 4:30 and as the days get longer slots will start at 5:45 thus corresponding with the sunset. With a team of 4 people this should only take 30 to 45 minutes.

~You may consider asking other parents from your class to choose a day of the week with you and/or take this opportunity to meet new parents while getting a bit of exercise.

Morning Snow Clearing Crew: If there is snow during the night we need people to help clear the rink before the first H.E. class uses the rink for the day. First class is at 9 am. This involves shoveling or running a snow blower. This work is not so precise and basically is just to clear the ice so kids can skate. There is access to a 4-wheeler on days that have more snow fall, i.e. more than 4 inches.

~We also need a list of people to be **On Call** for Morning Snow Clearing. We would like to have a list of people we can email or text to help on those mornings.

Morning Star Fit Kids Club

Morning Star school recently received a grant to start up a Fit Kids Club funded by the Foundation for Healthy Montanans. We are offering 3rd-5th graders an opportunity to start their day with some vigorous exercise to get their brains ready for learning. The program will begin in February and run until May from 8:00-8:30 meeting 4 days a week. We are

encouraging students to participate in 90 minutes per week so interested students must participate in 3 of the 4 sessions offered each week.

We Act Safely

Ice Skating Rink IS OPEN!!!

K-5 students now have the opportunity to ice skate during their lunch recess. Helmets (skiing, bike, hockey, riding, etc.) are REQUIRED for students to skate (with boots or with skates). Students also need to wear long pants, long sleeve shirts and gloves/mittens.

Adults must wear helmets when they are on the ice as well.

Important News Regarding Helmets for Ice Skating:

It's winter in Montana, and we have a great skating rink! (Thank you Mr. Curtice, Ms. Dover, Mary Black, and all our amazing parent volunteers!) Many of our children enjoy skating at recess and during Health Enhancement classes, and we want to make sure that everyone stays safe.

- ~In order to ensure that our students have properly fitted and working helmets, skaters must bring their own helmets from home where they have been checked and approved by parents/guardians. Please make sure that you explain the proper use of his/her helmet to your child. Many helmet manufacturers recommend helmet replacement on an annual basis or if there is a fall. Please make sure that you follow all manufacturers' guidelines for the helmet.
- ~If you are unable to provide a helmet for your child, please contact your child's teacher or our Parent Liaison, Libby Michaud (522-6540). We will do our best to get one for your child; however, you must fit it at home or come to school and fit it on your child's head. Thank you for complying with this important safety policy. Please call our office if you have any questions.

Dress for the Weather

~When the weather (temperature and wind chill) is near or above 10 degrees we will send students outside for recess, yes even in the snow and light rain.

~As we continue to experience variations in our weather, please send your child to school in weather appropriate clothing and shoes. Children not dressed appropriately (see guidelines in Student Handbook) will be unable to participate in all activities. In particular, K-2 students must have snow gear to play anywhere other than the blacktop.

We Show Respect

Be respectful of our start time – 8:30 a.m.

School begins at 8:30 a.m. regardless of the weather. We have supervision on the playground beginning at 8:00 a.m. and we appreciate when your child enters the building ready to begin their day on time. Children who are tardy begin their day at a disadvantage AND impact other children by interrupting instruction that has already begun. Thank you for planning ahead for traffic and the weather, ensuring that your child has every opportunity to begin their day successfully! IF YOU MUST BE LATE....please enter with your child and sign them in.

PAC Offering Shuttle for Both Holiday Programs

Holiday Program Date & Times:

Friday, 12/20 at 9:00 am & 12:45 pm

PAC is very excited to offer a shuttle to both the 9:00 am and 12:45 pm Holiday Programs again this year! Families and friends can conveniently park at the **Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints on** Henderson and Colter (just south of Arnold east of South 3rd; *Please see map to right*.) and ride in the warmth of a cozy Karst Stage shuttle to Morning Star's front door. Thank you Karst Stage!

The shuttle will run continuously between the church and school approximately every 15 minutes, as traffic allows. Below is the shuttle schedule:

- 8:00 am (leave church)
- Continuous shuttles, approximately every 15
- 11:15 am (last shuttle from school after morning program)
- 11:45 am (leave church)
- Continuous shuttles, approximately every 15 minutes
- 2:30 pm (last shuttle from the school after the afternoon program)

The bus will be parked on the north side of the church for loading and on the front sidewalk just before the front entrance to the school. The shuttle will accommodate twenty-five sitting passengers and fifteen standing passengers. We hope this will ease the stress of parking for this wonderful, and popular, event.

Parents, if you drive to the school, please watch for the shuttle and allow it to bring passengers to and from as quickly as possible.


